By his wounds you have been healed. (1 Pt 2:24)

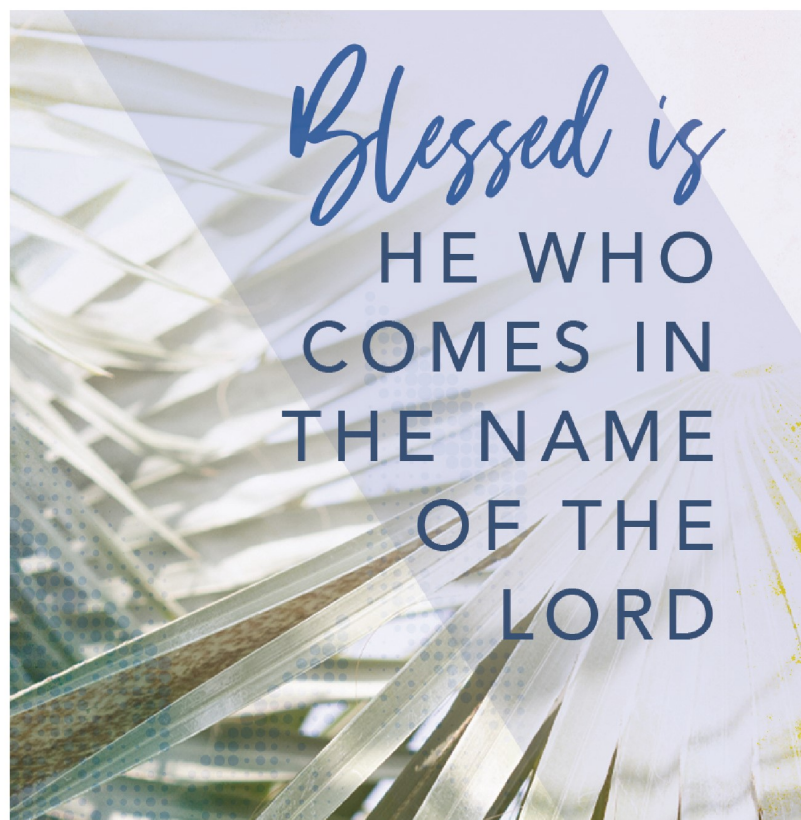

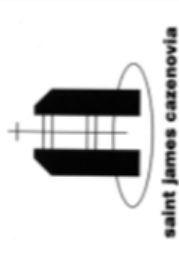
