Reopening of Church for Mass

By now you should have received a letter from Fr. Kevin regarding the reopening of the Church for Mass at 25% capacity. Mass will be on Sunday morning at 9:00a. St. Patrick's will celebrate Mass on Saturday nights at 4:00p.

The guidelines are listed in the next column and must be adhered to in order to attend Mass.

Reservations are necessary. You may contact the Parish Office, Monday - Thursday, 9:30a-1:30p. **Reservations will NOT be taken after 1:30p on Thursdays.** Fr. Kevin will also be offering Daily Masses on Thursday at 6:45a and 11:00a. No reservation is necessary, but you will have to sign in and follow all other guidelines for Mass.

Watch your mail for upcoming information on live streaming Mass from St. James.

We appreciate your help and cooperation in helping us to open our church safely and effectively for Mass.

Guidelines for Sunday Mass

Everyone **MUST** wear a mask in church at all times. Please bring a pocket-sized sanitizer for your personal use.

Because our seating capacity is limited; it is **necessary to make a reservation each week to attend Mass.** Please call the Parish Office Monday through Thursday, 9:30am- 1:30pm. **No reservations accepted after 1:30pm on Thursday.**

The Parking Lot door will be the ONLY entrance for Mass; this is where you will check in. You will be able to exit from any door.

You will be seated by an usher; seating will begin in the center section of the church and be filled in front to back to minimize contact. Families/households may sit together but maintain social distancing from other families/individuals. You must remain in your seat and not congregate with other parishioners before or after Mass.

Missalettes will not be in the pews - you may bring your own.

Singing for the congregation is allowed if social distancing is practiced and masks are worn.

Offertory Baskets will not be passed. There are collection baskets stationed in the back of the church for you to drop your offertory in as you enter or leave.

For distribution of Holy Communion:

- ◆ Holy Communion will be distributed by section to help maintain social distancing.
- ◆ Sanitize your hands before you leave your pew for Communion.
- ◆ Maintain social distancing as you wait in line (guidelines on floor).
- ◆ Keep your mask on when you approach for Holy Communion; after receiving, step to the side (social distance), lower your mask and then consume the host.
- ◆ Return to your pew for private prayer; after the final blessing, people will be dismissed section by section to limit contact.
- ◆ At dismissal, please again sanitize your hands before you leave your pew.

Guidelines for Daily Mass- Thursdays at 6:45am & 11am

Guidelines are the same as for Sunday Mass, with the following exceptions:

- ◆ No reservations are needed.
- ◆ Mass will be in the Main Church for easier distancing.
- ◆ Entry and check in will be at the Parking Lot door lobby beginning at 6:15am for the 6:45am and 10:30am for the 11:00am.
- ◆ Seating will be front to back, in the pews off the center aisle.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

We are all familiar with the refrain, "You have put on Christ. In him you have been baptized. Alleluia, alleluia!" In Baptism, we "put on" Christ. In putting on Christ, we put on all that Christ is and represents: hope, faith, and love. We are no longer bound to the sins and failures of the flesh, that part of us that resists God and relies exclusively on human means. It also means that we are not in debt to our past, complete with its sins, failures, regrets, fears, and unfulfilled dreams. There is always hope. In putting on Christ, we put on God's vision for the world, for all of His children and for us. We have been given a road map to guide our paths and a blueprint to follow for our life's journey.

There is no need for regret, and we are not tethered to our past. Is there anything in your past that you regret? Any decision or memory that continues to haunt you? We have all made mistakes, and we have this uncanny ability to continue beating ourselves up over things we can no longer do anything about, except learn from them. To put on Christ means that I can now bring God's unconditional love to my hurtful memories and



sinful choices. With each new moment and every new choice, I can start clean and live in freedom.

Imagine adults when the disciples were preaching and baptizing. They came to baptism not really knowing who they were, with pasts that were broken, seeking to live the joy of the Gospel they heard spoken to them and wanting the love they saw witnessed in the lives of those who believed. What tremendous celebrations their baptisms must have been! They could now have the support of a community, full participation in the sacraments

of the church, focus for their disordered lives, consolation, healing, and an understanding of what life is really all about.

Our lives are meant to be celebrations of the Spirit we have received in Baptism. How does that joy get expressed in and through you? When we truly understand that we have put on Christ, our burdens can become much lighter. It is odd that so many Christians look like they are carrying the weight of the world on their shoulders. Wouldn't it be wonderful if those weights could be lifted and joy experienced!

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." - Mt 11:28-30

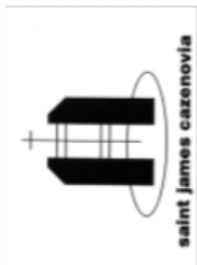

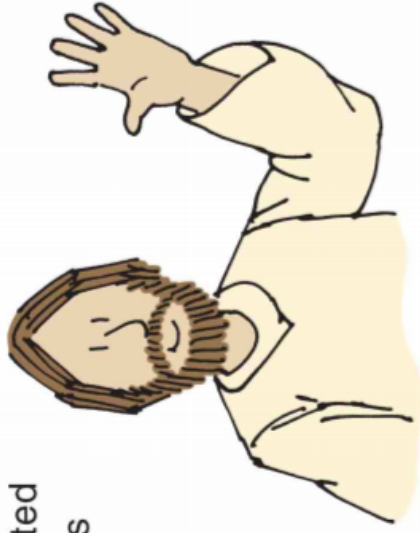
