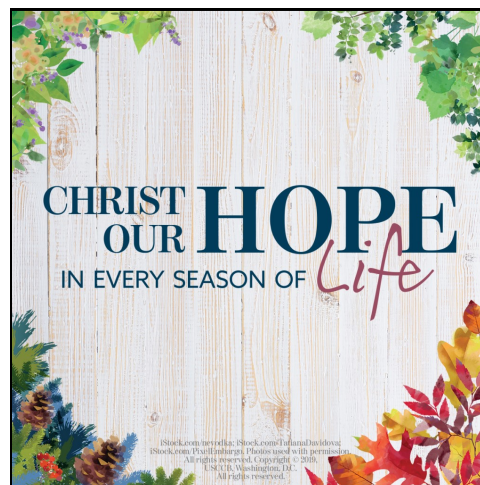

FROM THE US POSTAL SERVICE

If you vote by mail, we're committed to providing you a secure, effective way to deliver your ballot. Use this check list to prepare:

- √ Start today. Give yourself and your election officials ample time to complete the process.
- √ Rules and dates vary by state, so contact your election board to confirm. Find links at www.usps.com/votinginfo.
- √ Request your mail-in ballot (often called "absentee" ballot) at least 15 days before Election Day.
- √ Once received, follow the instructions. Add postage to the return envelope if needed.

We recommend you mail your ballot **at least 7 days BEFORE** Election day.

USPS is ready to deliver for you.
Make sure you're ready, too.

November 3, 2020**

**All Polls are open from
6:00am to 9:00pm**

You may vote on Election day, or vote during the nine (9) days of Early Voting, October 24, 2020 through November 1, 2020, or apply and vote by absentee ballot.

ABSENTEE VOTING

You may apply by mail, fax, email, online or phone. For voters applying for an absentee ballot by mail, the deadline to apply is October 27th, but the Postal Service recommends that voters apply at least fifteen days before Election Day. Apply in person by November 2nd.

You may also download an application on the website www.madisoncounty.ny.gov/BOE scan and email, fax, or mail it to the Board of Elections.

All voters are eligible for absentee ballots, if you are applying because of Covid-19, please mark or request for Temporary Illness. For voters returning their voted absentee ballot, it must be dropped off at the BOE or voting sites on or before November 3, 2020 and if sent by mail it must be postmarked by November 3, 2020 and received by the Board of Elections by November 10, 2020. The Postal Service recommends mailing voted ballots back at least seven days before the General Election.

What do you think the vineyard looked like?



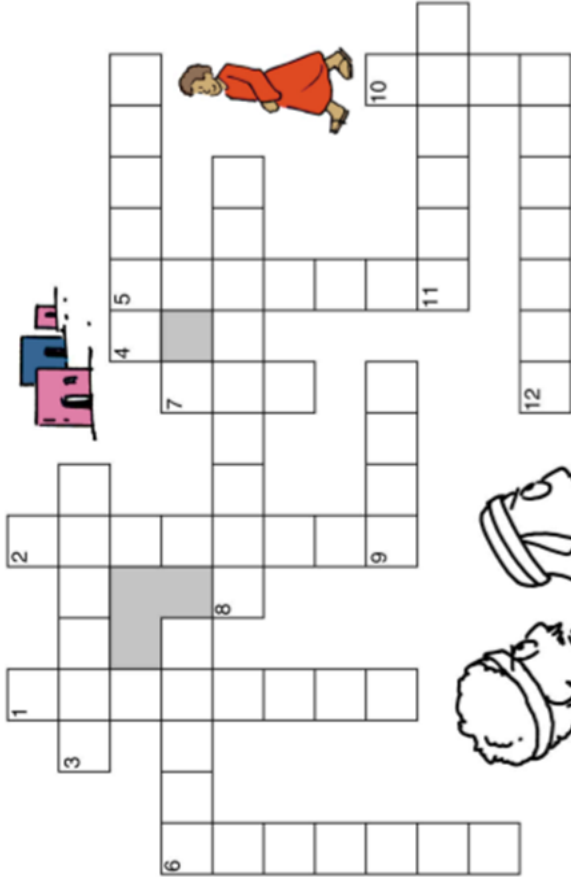
