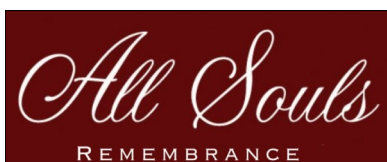

SUNDAY MASS REMINDERS!

As we move into fall and flu season, it becomes more important for those attending Mass to **PLEASE CALL TO MAKE A RESERVATION.**

Following State mandates on seating capacity, calling ahead to make a reservation guarantees you (and your family) a seat at Mass. For those who forget or choose not to make a reservation in advance, are taking a chance on not being able to attend due to limited seating. Also, walk-in registration creates a back log at check-in causing a delay in the starting of Mass. Just a reminder, **once Mass starts, the doors are closed and no one is allowed to enter. PLEASE, BE ON TIME.**

We are so grateful that more and more people are coming to Mass each Sunday increasing the attendance. It would be hard to have to turn people away (those who walk-up), as we have less and less seats available.



Do we really understand how important our relationships with our brothers and sisters throughout the world truly are? 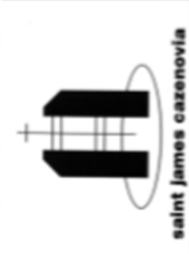

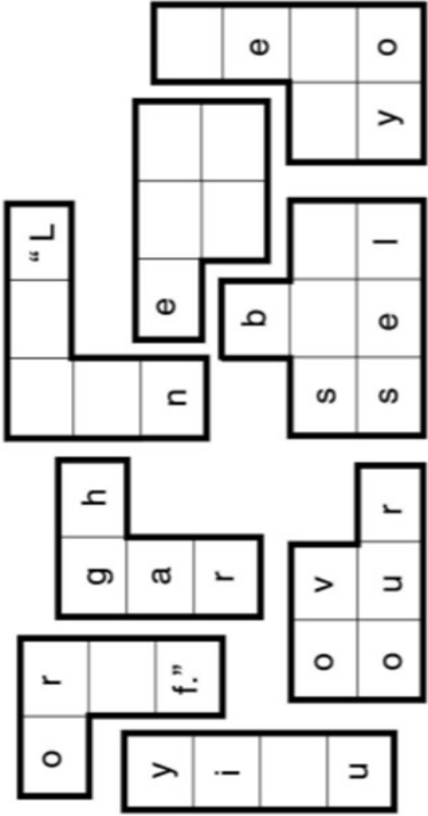
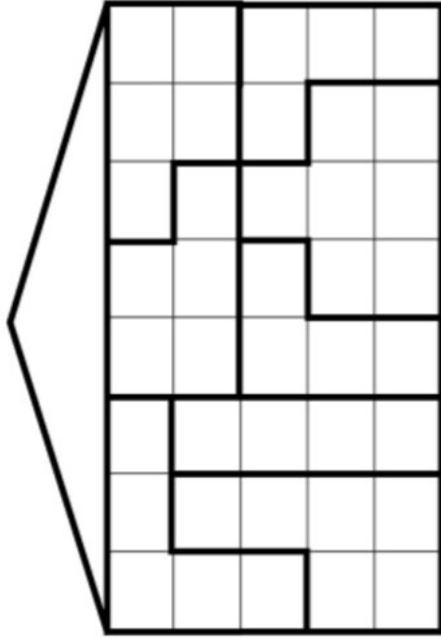
